


Go rest high on that mountain piano

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Adjustable piano benches are an excellent option; especially for growing children, those who share the piano, and those who still become comfortable on the keyboard. Traditional piano benches are not one-size-fits-all - you may have to adjust the bench in order to achieve proper piano posture. With your feet in the picture, your hips are no longer your center of gravity - your back is free to bend back and forth, and your torso can provide momentum for your upper body during strong dynamics and long octave spans. Avoid sitting at the piano as you would on your desktop; The keyboard can cover your knees, but your hips are not designed to underneath the tool. Sitting too high in front of the piano can cause pain in the upper back and neck; Sitting on a low makes for poor gaming positions and reduced keyboard vision. Your height should allow you to touch the keys with your forearms parallel to the floor. The hips are almost parallel; It is normal for the knees to be a little lower than your hips. If you need to add height, sit on a solid pillow or evenly folded blankets or bath towels. The sheet music should be on the eye-level. Each touch key on the piano will require one resistor and two wires/cables. Solder one wire to each leg of the resistor, but make sure to leave part of the leg sticking out. The leg will be used to connect to the foil at the next step. Make as many of them as you plan to have piano keys Take an extra bit of foot you have saved and poke it through the corner or side of one of your squares of aluminum foil. Fold your foot over the edge back to yourself, To make the plug hold hold more strongly,assemble all your keys, like thisUsing your tape, attach each key to your surface, (leave some of the foil exposed.) It's ok to tape over the resistor, but be sure to remember which wire is attached to the side of the resistor that touches the foil and which wire is not after attaching all the keys to the surface, take the wire that is connected to the same side of the cutter and connect to the same side of the cutter. Basically, we want to connect all the non-foil hand resistors together. They can be solder or simply tied to the tape. You will have one wire that is unconnected to anything. This will be our common send wire. Connect the general send wire left over from the previous step to Pin 2 on Arduino. Then connect the key wires to Pins 3-10, starting with the very left key on Pin 2 and ending with the right key on Pin 10. Take your buzzer and connect the pin with a negative (-) to the ground (GND) pin on Arduino. Connect the positive pin (+) to the Pin A4 on Arduino. Get and install the CapSense Arduino library if it's not yet installed. This can be downloaded from Github here. If you don't know how to install Arduino library in version Arduino IDE, link to this guide to Arduino.cc. Attached below, you will find a zip file that contains the Code Arduino for the capacity-touch Arduino piano keyboard. Download it and unpack it somewhere on your computer. Open CapSensePiano.ino in Arduino IDE and download the code on arduino. Make sure that the libraries you need are loaded and stored, you must now be able to press the foil keys and hear the relevant notes played through the buzzer. If the keys aren't responsive or run without a touch, you can adjust the CAP_THRESHOLD in the Arduino sketch to determine what value the keys are called. Lower values can trigger keys, and higher values will reduce the number of keys that are triggered by mistake.
